

# The Chembakolli Story

Geographical Activities that can be developed through the use of

picture books.

<p><b>Geography is about SPACE</b> Draw a map Where are Asia, India and Chembakolli?</p> <p>Recap - Using globes, world maps and atlases - ask the <i>chn</i> to locate the position of the UK in the world. Show <i>chn</i> using Google Earth. <i>chn</i> to browse the map for other countries - collect ideas. <i>ThPSh</i>.</p> <p>Using atlases, maps and aerial photographs of the world, ask the children to find out which countries and seas border India. <i>chn</i> to label on a blank map of Asia as many countries and seas as possible.</p> <p>Plenary - Discuss what we already know about India and what we would like to know. Draw out key questions to be placed on a parking board to be referred to throughout the topic.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>The Chembakolli Story</b></p>	<p><b>Geography is about the interaction that happens between People, Place and the Environment.</b> What is it like in Chembakolli?</p> <p>Recap - Can you spell Chembakolli? Play 'pin the pin on India' - 'closest child wins 2 stickers. Listen to Audio Track 1 from CD - Footsteps in the Forest. Explain that we are going to think about what Chembakolli is like as a place.</p> <p>Main Teaching - Discuss with the children using photographs of India and Chembakolli, what the landscape is like. Define the term landscape for display. Explain to <i>chn</i> that there are physical and human features of a landscape. Define these terms and collect a couple of examples.</p> <p>Ask the <i>chn</i> to choose one photograph of Chembakolli and stick it into the centre of a large sheet of paper. Can you continue drawing the image at either side of the photograph to show what might be found in Chembakolli.</p> <p>Remind <i>chn</i> of the story we listened to.</p> <p>Plenary - Share the <i>chn</i>'s photographs and discuss the human and physical features they have drawn. Share some ideas about how Chembakolli is similar and different to Jump.</p>
<p><b>Geography makes connections between people and places.</b> How is Chembakolli connected to other places?</p> <p>Show <i>chn</i> a variety of photographs depicting the different jobs that people in Chembakolli might do.</p> <p>Listen to Audio Track 5. Why is tea important in Chembakolli? How does it connect with people around the world? How is <i>Bommi's</i> life global?</p> <p>Explain that you want <i>chn</i> to complete a connection map. On a large sheet of paper - draw your house in the middle. Draw some of the places you visit around your home e.g. shops, friend's houses, school. If a place is near your house, draw a short line, if it is far away draw a long line. HA to think about the direction of places.</p>	<p><b>Among other curriculum areas ESD embraces science, geography, citizenship and is underpinned by concepts.</b> How did the Adivasi people change their lives?</p> <p>Discuss how they worked together to promote a positive change - Audio Track 6.</p> <p>Main Teaching - Show <i>chn</i> various pictures of the local area - <i>ThPSh</i> - if you could change one aspect of the local area, what would it be? <i>chn</i> to make notes about what in Jump they would like to change. Share ideas and take a class vote of which area of life we would like to change. Decide on what action to take and allocate jobs for next lesson.</p> <p>Plenary - Discuss what it is we want to change and review how we are going to do this.</p>	<p><b>Geography is about "real people" who live in "real places."</b> Where is India in relation to the UK?</p> <p>Show <i>chn</i> using Google Earth.</p> <p>Recap - Where is India in relation to the UK? Show <i>chn</i> using Google Earth. Begin by showing the UK and move to India.</p> <p>We are going to take a virtual journey to Chembakolli. We are at school at the moment. <i>ThPSh</i> - How would we get to Chembakolli? Project images of Jump on to the board. First we would need to get to Manchester Airport. Discuss with <i>chn</i> how we would get there and show them images of the airport.</p> <p>Take a virtual journey.</p> <p>Plenary - On arriving in India at New Delhi airport (show images) you don't know the language, can't read the signs and are unsure of where to go to continue your journey to Chembakolli. Write a speech bubble to show what you might be thinking and how you feel.</p>
